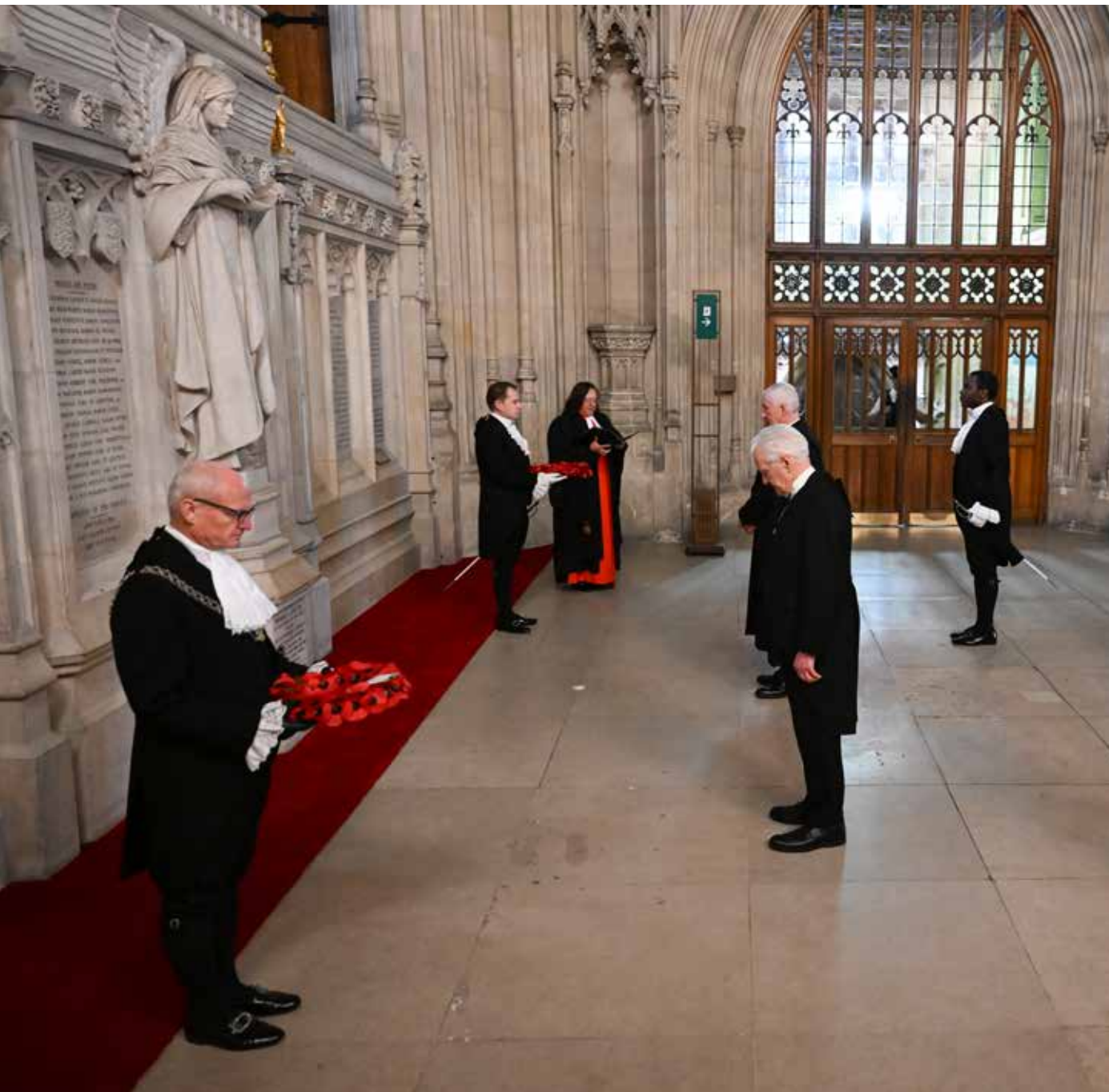
Foreword by the Speaker of the House of Commons

Introduction

Members of the House of Commons, House of Lords, staff, and police officers have given their lives in service to their country at times of war, conflict, and terrorism. Their service is remembered and recognised around the Parliamentary estate on a series of commemorative memorials and in books of remembrance which collectively record the names of those who died during the First and Second World Wars and other conflicts and acts of terrorism.

This booklet presents each memorial located in the Palace of Westminster and wider Parliamentary Estate along with a list of all known names of the individuals who are commemorated.



Memorials to victims of the First and Second World Wars

LOCATION

St Stephen's Porch, Westminster Hall

The Recording Angel Memorial

The Portland Stone Recording Angel Memorial is dedicated to Members of both Houses, Officers and their sons, including police officers, who lost their lives in the First World War, 1914-1918. Created in 1921 by the Australian sculptor Sir Bertram Mackennal (1863-1931), it shows a central winged figure representing the angel assigned to record the deeds of all those who had died. The figure is flanked by eight arched panels bearing the names of the fallen with two, small, gilded bronze statuettes, Faith and Fortitude, standing over the central section. During the Second World War, the memorial suffered bomb damage and required numerous repairs.

Joint Parliamentary War Memorial Stained Glass Window

Resembling the great east window above the altar of a cathedral, the stained glass window above The Recording Angel on St Stephen's Porch memorialises those who died in action or in the bombing of the Palace of Westminster during the Second World War between 1939 and 1945. Surrounding the Royal Arms, it includes the service badges and armorial bearings or initials of 22 MPs, 34 Peers, and 5 members of staff, including two police officers. A display cabinet nearby describes the position in the glass of those commemorated. The window was designed by Sir Ninian Comper (1864-1960), the Scottish Gothic Revival architect, and replaced the Victorian window by A.W.N. Pugin which was blown out in September 1940 when a bomb fell in Old Palace Yard nearby. Following a service of dedication by the Archbishop of Canterbury on 12 November 1952, the war-time Prime Minister, Sir Winston Churchill (1874-1965), gave a speech to the Parliamentary community gathered before him in Westminster Hall.

The works of art in the Royal Gallery mark important British military victories, especially those of the last two centuries. In the south-east corner of the room, bespoke wall panels form the Peers War Memorial and list the names of the Peers, Lords of Parliament, Officers of the House of Lords, and their sons who died in the two World Wars. Their names, carved into the oak panels, are highlighted with gold leaf; eleven panels for the First World War (1914-1919) and three panels for the Second World War (1939-1945).

In the adjacent bay window in an inlaid ebony display case designed by Charles Spooner (1862-1938) and made by Edward Barnsley (1900-1987), three Books of Remembrance are presented listing the names of Peers, their wives and their sons and daughters who died in the First and Second World Wars. The books are in the style of illuminated manuscripts of the Middle Ages, with names, initial letters and heraldic achievements decorated in colour and gilded by hand on vellum. The two First World War books, presented in 1928, were illuminated by Graily Hewitt (1864-1952) and his assistant, Miss I.D. Henstock, and the bindings were made in white pigskin by Douglas Cockerell (1870-1945) and his son, Sydney Morris Cockerell (1906-1987). Miss Henstock was also responsible for the illumination of the Second World War commemorative book.



Also on display in the Royal Gallery are two evocative objects memorialising other significant events in the Second World War. The first is a piece of timber from the jetty used in the evacuation of the British Expeditionary Force from Dunkirk between May and June 1940. Although thousands of men and civilians lost their lives, more than 338,000 British, French, and other Allied troops were safely evacuated from the French port and nearby beaches in an operation led by the Royal Navy and Royal Air Force. The 'Miracle of Dunkirk' was a huge boost for British morale at a time when Nazi ambitions were turning towards Britain. The timber was presented to the House of Lords by the Dunkirk Veterans Association in 1971.

The second item is a small, glazed box containing samples of sand from the five beaches of the 'D-Day' Normandy Landings on 6 June 1944: Utah, Omaha, Gold, Juno, and Sword. Codenamed 'Operation Overlord', more than 160,000 Allied forces courageously carried out the arduous invasion of occupied Western Europe. The box was presented to the House of Lords in 1985 by the Normandy Veterans Association, West Wales Branch No.55.





LOCATION

House of Commons Chamber





A series of shields line the interior walls of the House of Commons Chamber marking the lives of individually named MPs who were killed during the First and Second World Wars, or during acts of terrorism.

The shields depict either the coat of arms of the Member if they have one, or the intertwined initial letters of their name in gold leaf on a royal blue background. The shields commemorating those MPs lost in the First World War are at the southern end of the Chamber near to the door from the Lobby, and those from the Second World War are at the north end. The majority of shields were installed in October 1950 replacing the originals lost when the Chamber was bombed in May 1941. The bronze shields, fixed into narrow wooden frames, were created using a method of coloured enamelling which is centuries old and known as *champlevé*. Powdered glass, mixed into paint, filled troughs carved into the metal to form the pattern; it was then fused onto the metal by firing the shield at a high temperature. Both the enamel and the metal surfaces were then polished. Three MPs who were not originally included in the set of First World War shields were added in 2015 above the south-west door. This practice continues today and MPs who have died in service by acts of terrorism and extremism are commemorated with a painted coat of arms in their name.



LOCATION

Lower Waiting Hall

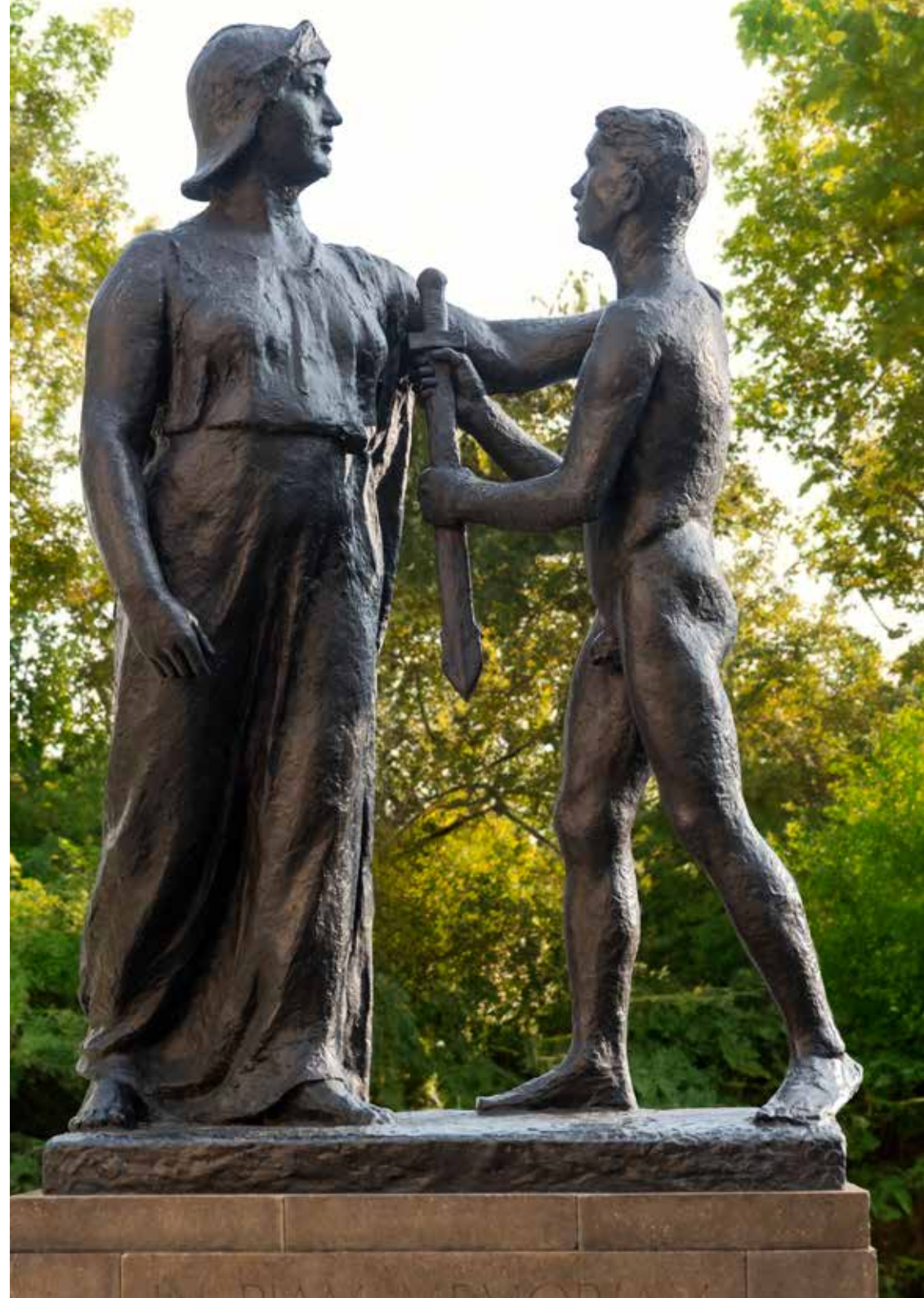
Presented in a display case in the Lower Waiting Hall is a Book of Remembrance dedicated to MPs, sons and daughters, who were killed in the Second World War. Illuminated by hand in red and black on vellum and with a small gold portcullis in the top corner of every page, the book lists 57 names and the armed service of those to whom it is dedicated. It bears an inscription from the New Testament epistles of Paul the apostle to Timothy [6:20] Keep that which is committed to thy trust. This reference, encouraging the soldier to guard and defend what has been entrusted to him, acts as a metaphor for courage, loyalty and dedication. This book was given to the House of Commons Library on 14 December 1949.

Two further Books of Remembrance are also owned by the House of Commons Library which document the names, rank and biographical summaries of those MPS who were killed in the First World War and were given in 1932. The First World War Books of Remembrance were scribed and illuminated by George Scruby, and the Second World War Book of Remembrance was scribed and illuminated by William M. Gardner and Norman Ball.

LOCATION

Black Rod's Garden

Soon after the end of the First World War, the Scottish sculptor John Tweed (1869-1933) was commissioned to produce a memorial to Members and staff of the House of Lords, and their sons, who had died in the conflict. Tweed's two-figure bronze, depicting a youth offering up a sword to his country, was unveiled by the Prince of Wales (later Edward VIII) on 10 March 1932. Originally sited in the Royal Gallery, the bronze is now located in Black Rod's Garden framed by the arch of Royal Court. On the base of the sculpture is the inscription 'In piam memoriam 1914-1919' translated as 'In pious memory 1914-1919'.

LOCATION

Committee Room 14

This decorative silver plaque on the south wall of Committee Room 14 in the Palace of Westminster commemorates Field Marshal Earl Kitchener (1850-1916), Secretary of State for War 1914 to 1916. Kitchener delivered his last speech to Members of Parliament in this committee room on 2 June 1916, three days before he died in the sinking of HMS Hampshire. On 29 June 1916, on the floor of the House of Commons chamber, a request for a memorial inscription to honour Kitchener's military career and distinguished service was granted by the Vice Chamberlain of his Majesty's Household. Kitchener was the highest-ranking British officer to die in action in the First World War.



LOCATION

Press Gallery

Two commemoration panels hang in the Parliamentary Press Gallery. A bronze panel bears the names of the six members of the Press Gallery who were killed in the First World War, and beneath it hangs a photo of its unveiling in 1920. On the opposite wall, unveiled in 1956, hangs an oak panel naming the members of the press and their organisations who died in the Second World War.

Committee Clerks' Office, House of Commons

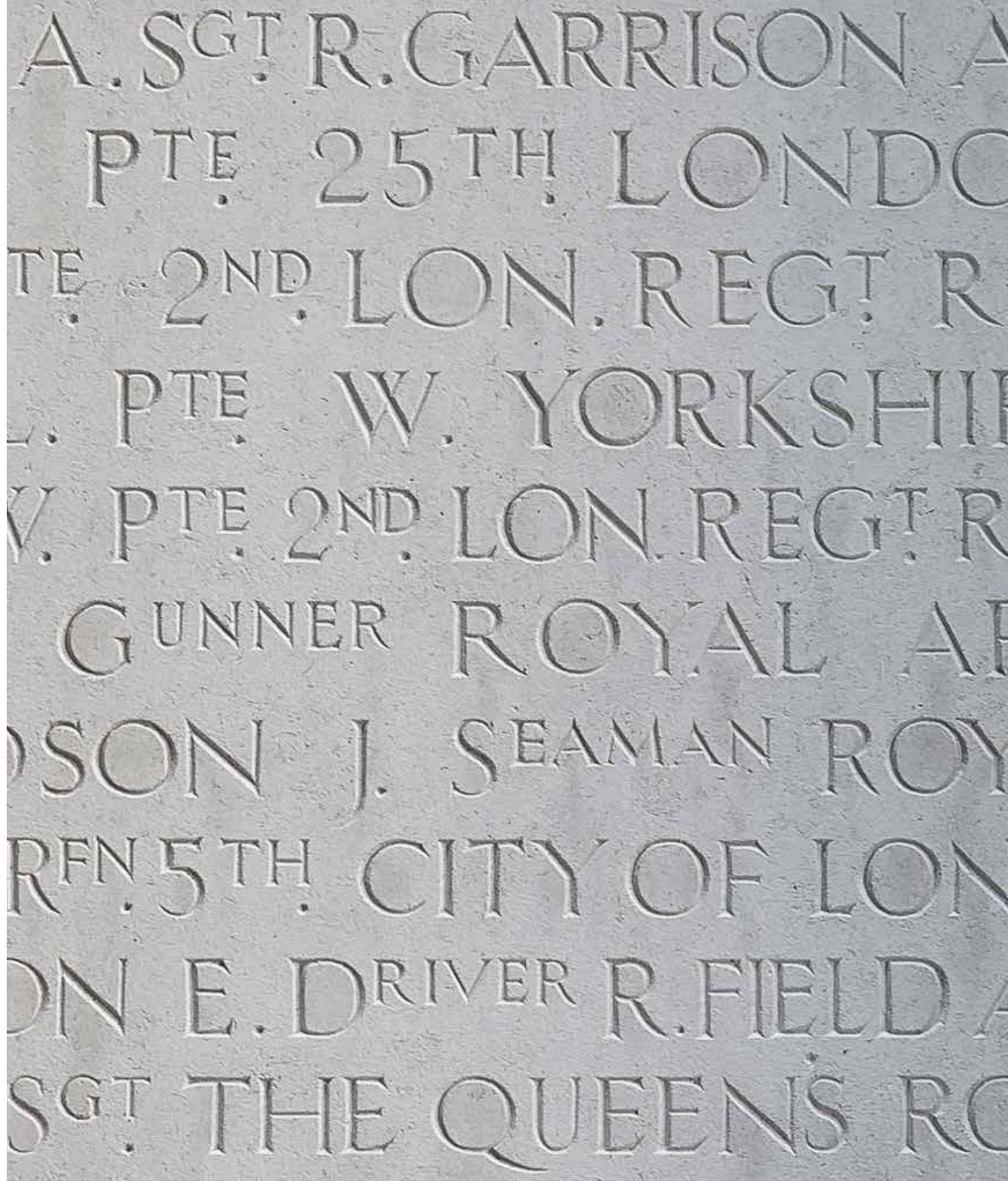
This memorial, found in the historic Committee Clerks Office, commemorates the five House of Commons Committee clerks who were killed whilst serving in the First World War.



LOCATION

Chancellors Court

The Houses of Parliament Staff War memorial, to be found on the west wall of Chancellors Court, was paid for by members of staff to remember Parliamentary colleagues who lost their lives in the First World War. The stone memorial was unveiled by the Lord Great Chamberlain on 6 July 1923 and bears the inscription 'Tranquil you lie, your knightly virtue proved'. The words were taken from a war poem published in 1919 by Sir John Stanhope Arkwright (1872-1974) and later set to music by Gustav Holst for the hymn 'O Valiant Hearts'.





LOCATION

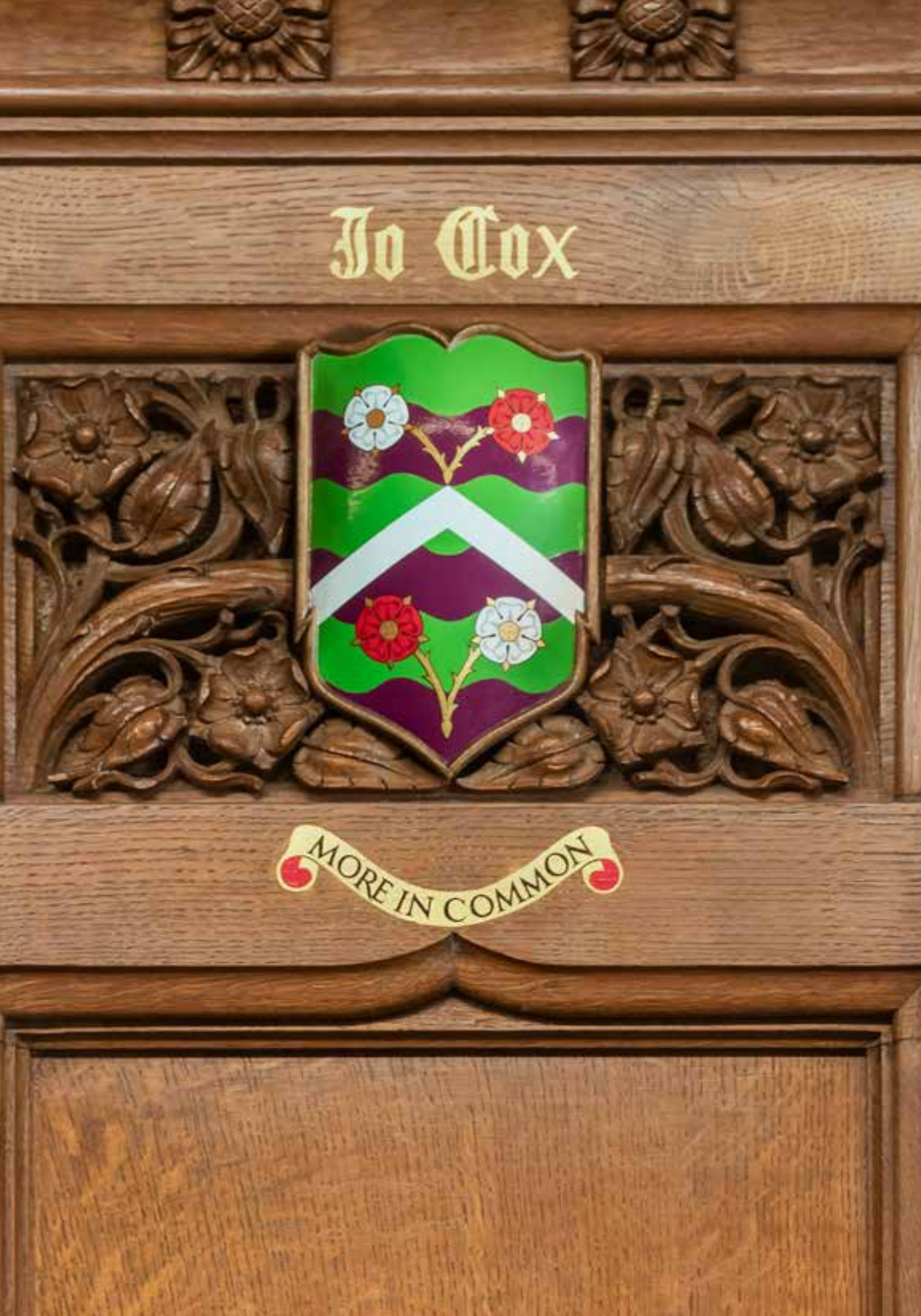
Millbank House

This stone wall memorial in the entrance hall of Millbank House recognises staff of the Ecclesiastical Commissioners (later the Church Commissioners) who died in the First World War. The memorial was installed in 1920. The building was acquired by the House of Lords in 2005 from the Church Commissioners, successor to the Ecclesiastical Commissioners, and now forms part of the Parliamentary Estate.

LOCATION

House of Commons Chamber

MPs who were killed by acts of terrorism and extremism are commemorated in the House of Commons Chamber. Those named include MPs who were victims of either the struggle for Irish Independence or of the Northern Ireland Troubles. More recently, the heraldic shields of two more MPs have been added: Jo Cox and Sir David Amess, who were murdered while working in their constituencies in 2016 and 2021 respectively.

The shields marking victims of the Northern Ireland Troubles are spread between the south end where most are to be found above the entrance doorway, and the north end where they are to be seen over the door behind the Speaker's Chair. Several MPs who died in the Troubles have been added since the Good Friday Agreement.

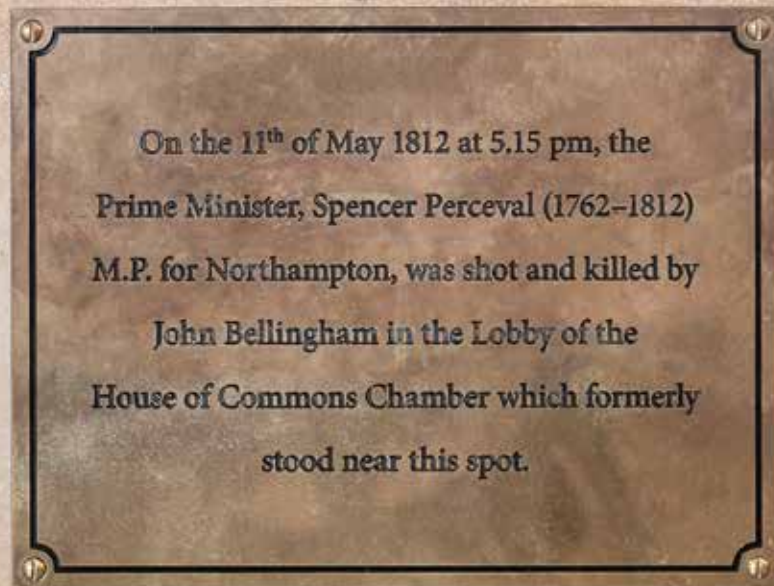

LOCATION

St Stephen's Hall

The assassination of the Prime Minister Spencer Perceval MP (1762-1812) at about 5.15 pm on 11th May 1812 took place in the former lobby of the House of Commons, where St Stephen's Hall now stands. Perceval, who had been summoned to attend the House, was shot dead by John Bellingham, an unsuccessful businessman who blamed his financial difficulties on a lack of support from the government, as he entered the lobby.

Bellingham, who had hidden his pistol in a secret pocket of his greatcoat, calmly gave himself up and was subsequently taken to the bar of the House of Commons before being placed under arrest.

LOCATION

New Palace Yard

Police Constable Keith Palmer, GM, was killed in the terrorist attack at Westminster on 22 March 2017. This plaque marks the location where he fell, and a further memorial was installed by the Metropolitan Police in Parliament Square at the Carriage Gates Entrance.
